

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SISSI 15 Milwaukee





On May 19, 2022 executives from Milwaukee Tool and dignitaries from throughout the state participated in the groundbreaking ceremony at what will become the new site of the estimated 525,000 square foot facility that will make and assemble Milwaukee Tool products.

Milwaukee's latest expansion will accommodate the company's growing power tool accessories and power tool business, and will also serve as a centralized repair facility. The new location will create more than 800 new jobs, and is planned to open in mid-2023. They plan to integrate advanced technology and manufacturing equipment at this new location. The facility will house critical accessory manufacturing capabilities, and will join the company's other service hub in Greenwood, Indiana, as one of Milwaukee Tool's main axis points for service operations.

The company is creating 1,200 jobs, of which 800 will be at the new facility in Grenada and 400 will be at the company's other locations across Mississippi. According to the Mississippi Development Authority (MDA), Milwaukee Tool will have more than 5,000 employees in Mississippi and MDA Chief Economic Development Officer Bill Cork said Milwaukee Tool will be one of the largest employers in the state following this project's completion.

T.W. Frierson's in-house design team, Design Constructors, Inc. is leading the charge as the Architect of Record for this project.

In August 2021 we were approached by Riley Construction about partnering on a design-build project for Milwaukee Tool that would be built in Grenada, MS. Riley has had previous success building for Milwaukee Tool, but had limited knowledge of the subcontractor market in this region. They reached out to us because of our proximity to the site, our knowledge of working in this region, our self-performance capabilities, and our design-build expertise.

Design Constructors, Inc. worked closely with Milwaukee's architect, Steven Perry Smith, to take their conceptual drawings to a complete set that is ready for construction.

Of particular importance to Milwaukee is showcasing their brand. The main entryway and office spaces will be heavily branded and has required close coordination and approvals with their branding department. We are currently in the process of assisting to develop a fully rendered virtual walk-through of the interior spaces for Milwaukee's Brand Department to "experience" the building prior to finalizing the interior finish selections.

One of the unique features of this building is the wall system that consists of insulated precast walls and a Kirby Pre-engineered Metal Building. The building is situated on the 80-acre site to be highly visible from the interstate, requiring a high level of finish on the exterior of the building. All the wall panels will be custom color matched Milwaukee's "TOR Red" and "Bungalow Beige" to make the brand easily recognizable as people are driving by.

This facility will feature approximately 353,000 square feet of manufacturing space where the company will make Sawzall blades and hole saws. The power requirements for their process required the design and construction of a dedicated substation on site. It will also be home to a 110,000 square foot service center, where customers can send in their tools to be repaired or replaced and a 61,000 square foot office and mezzanine. Additionally, the 80-acre site allows Milwaukee to expand their existing footprint and add an additional building in the future.

In an effort to recruit potential employees and to give back to the community, unique to this facility because of its rural location, Milwaukee is investing in the creation of a Clinic and Wellness Center within their new facility. The Clinic will be staffed with licensed professions for employees, their families, and the community to visit when they are sick or needing their annual check-ups. There will also be a Fitness Center equipped with standard gym equipment that will be available for employees and their families to utilize.

This facility is currently under construction as a partnership between T.W. Frierson and Riley Construction and is anticipated to be complete in Mid-2023.

HISTORY OF THE WALL DOGS

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We have self performed concrete services long before we established Professional Concrete Solutions, LLC a subsidiary of T.W. Frierson. We specialize in providing commercial concrete services for contractors, developers, property management companies, and city agencies.

Affectionately called the "Wall Dogs", our full-service team of expert concrete contractors are 100% committed to meeting our client's needs. We bring experience, pride, and reliability to every job site. With experience that spans industries and scope, you can count on us to stand behind our work.

In the early 1990's, T.W. Frierson Contractor, Inc. developed relationships with several local developers that were constructing tilt-up concrete wall buildings which included poured in place concrete dock walls.

After completing several of these projects, we realized that our forming operations were not very efficient, leading us to start looking for a good long-term solution that would allow us to continue self performing this work. It was decided that we needed to hire a concrete formwork person that could bolster our abilities and be a mentor to others.

T.W. Frierson has been self-performing concrete work for over 40 years!



We were fortunate to find Jeff Smith who joined us from Concrete Form Erectors. With his expertise, we were able to build a great team that became known as The Wall Dogs. Over the next ten years The Wall Dogs acquired many new team members, allowing us to have full concrete crews at three to four jobsites simultaneously. They have been instrumental to our success with clients like Nissan North America and Bridgestone America's. They have constructed many complicated concrete pit and trench projects, including a 2400 ton hydraulic press pit foundation and large curing trenches and presses. Additionally, this group has always been willing to travel and have made impacts on our projects in Florida, Texas, Mississippi, Arkansas, Kentucky, Maryland, Indiana, among other states in the Southeastern United States.

Today, this group is known as Professional Concrete Solutions, LLC, a wholly owned subsidiary of T.W. Frierson Contractor, Inc. They perform our concrete work for foundations, slabs, pits, walls, and tilt-up panels. This group is instrumental in allowing us to control the critical path of our projects while ensuring our quality is second to none. We are very proud of our company's history and the positive impact that The Wall Dogs have made over the last twenty six years!

AMEC PUBLISHING HOUSE BUILDING DEDICATION

The new state-of-the-art Publishing House features a curated collection of artistic expressions, accentuating its capacity of storytelling across borders. Various gallery spaces in the building feature artwork from Memphis-based visual artist and dedicated AMEC member Terry Lynn, which will be part of the permanent art collection of the Publishing House. The space also features a series of quilts in the two-story lobby from fiber artist Dr. Judi Wortham and a prominent portion of the exterior façade showcases the work of Brandon "BMike" Odums, a New Orleans-based muralist.

Serving both the connectional AMEC and the Nashville community, the new Publishing House is designed to be a combination of working office and gathering spaces; an impressive triumph fit for the evolving city. The Publishing House remains the publishing operation hub for the African Methodist Episcopal Church and houses eight other departments for the denomination:

- Chief Financial Officer
- Chief Information Officer
- Department of Research and Scholarship
- The Christian Recorder the oldest continuous periodical by persons of African descent in the country
- Departments of Church Growth and Development
- Retirement Services
- Global Witness and Ministry
- House the resident Bishop and headquarters for the 13th Episcopal District

Each of these AMEC departments are housed in individual office suites. They benefit from shared and collaborative spaces such as high-tech conference rooms and a shared printing/copying center.

The broader Nashville community is also poised to benefit from the Publishing House's new building. In addition to the offices and departments, the building features spaces the public is invited to enjoy and engage. A permanent art collection is on display and many works will be showcased in a dedicated gallery space on the first floor. The lobby is designed to be a multi-functional space that is equipped to hold chapel services, chamber concerts, literary readings, community meetings, lectures, and even theatrical productions. When this space is not reserved, the lobby will remain open as a community reading room, fit with seating, ample outlets, charging devices and Wi-Fi for those in the community to enjoy. The third floor of the building offers a banquet space, designed for community receptions, galas, and celebrations and features a private balcony that overlooks Nashville.







"Storytelling, in all its forms, is a hallmark of the African continent and diaspora. From griots and folk-tellers to poets and singers, the crafting and sharing of a story is part-and-parcel with the rich heritage of Blackness. 

Skyline temporarily changes as 92-foot church steeple goes in for year-long repair

When driving into the city of Brentwood, it's hard to miss the beautiful steeple atop Brentwood United Methodist Church.

Originally installed in 1976, the steeple is in dire need of renovation. That's why it was removed from its perch for that work to begin.

"The steeple atop our church has come to be known in Brentwood skies and loved for the beautiful music that sounds out from the carillon throughout the day," said Julia Todd, director of operations at the church. "Many in the community enjoy hearing the music while they enjoy lunch on our campus.

"While we will temporarily miss the sights and sounds the steeple has provided us for over 40 years, we look forward to reinforcing our facilities to better serve the community for the next 40 years and beyond."

Renovation of the BUMC steeple could take more than a year. While the steeple will have new exterior cladding, it won't look different after the renovation. The beautiful white cross at its peak will remain intact.


In historian and church member T. Vance Little's book, "A History of Brentwood United Methodist Church," he shared that the steeple was not originally going to be included in the new build because the cost was beyond the funds raised for the building. However, the Walter Nipper family generously gifted the funds to make sure the steeple was included.

There were a few failed attempts at installing the giant steeple before it was successfully placed in its permanent home in 1976.

Campbellsville Industries Inc., based out of Kentucky, will handle the renovations. T.W. Frierson is the general contractor helping to coordinate the project, the same contractor that helped build several sections of the church, along with the Turner Discipleship Center, Haney Hall and the sanctuary.

The worksite around the steeple will be closed for public safety during the renovations. Church leaders want the community to be assured that the steeple will be back, however, they will need to be patient. The process could take more than a year.








CONSTRUCTION OF PORTOBELLO AMERICA FACTORY MAKING MAJOR STRIDES

ortobello America's vision of having a full-service, state-of-the-art production facility in the United States is getting closer and closer to becoming a major reality.


According to James "Jed" Durbin, the company's Vice President of Manufacturing & Outsourcing, "Everything is on schedule, and we anticipate a March or April (2023) startup."

Durbin added, "From Day One of production, the new factory will be able to double originally planned capacity of smaller pieces, such as 8 x 8", 3 x 6", 3 x 12" and everything in between. There is a strong demand from our North American customer base for these to augment some of our best-selling porcelain collections. The pieces will be produced using the same body materials as included in our field tile ranges, such as Terralma and Gouach. And they will be just as high-end in appearance."

The new Baxter facility will not only be a major sustainable manufacturing venue; it will also be the new home of Portobello America's North American offices. Baxter is located in Putnam County, considered a national hub regarding the manufacture of porcelain tile due to the local obtainability of natural clay and feldspar supplies. The new factory's updated personnel plan is now expected to generate at least 230 local jobs.



"Our new plant will be fully automated with absolutely the most modern technology. This will include laser-guided systems, automated packaging and palleting, robots that move materials from one area of the plant to another... and much, much more. Obviously, we've got much to accomplish before our startup," concluded Jed Durbin. "And, we will get it done!"







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
